

The Pink Panther Gang



3 October 2007 (Belgrade)

Three Serbian nationals who were part of the "Pink Panther Gang" were sentenced in Belgrade to multiple prison terms for a 2004 robbery of a Tokyo jewelry store that netted \$32 Million worth of jewels. Those sentenced Aleksandar Radulovic, Diordiiie Rasovic and Snezana Panajotovic.

The group involved in the Tokyo robbery also included a British national who was not apprehended. The "Pink Panther" gang is suspected in other heists across Europe, including a 3 minute \$ 40 Million robbery of a London jewelry store in May of 2003. Some of the others suspects are Nebojsa Denic and Predrag Vujosevic.

In a similar incident during the summer of 2007, a group of two males entered a Ginza (Tokyo) jewelry store and in a mere 32 seconds stole a diamond tiara and necklace worth about \$2 Million. The two suspects appeared to be Eastern Europeans and the Pink Panther gang is again the prime suspect. In all of the cases mentioned, none of the stolen property was ever recovered.

#### COMPUTER ADVICE FOR **FACULTY**

Prior to last year's upgrade (?) of My Fresno State, faculty was able to simply copy and paste class rosters into a regular Excel spread This was very helpful for noting information and/or grades for various students and did not require the tedious transcription of student names into an Excel spreadsheet.

After the upgrade, however, copying the roster in MyFresnoState and pasting it into a spreadsheet, resulted in an annoying second row for each name that could not be readily removed. The MFS web site did not provide information on circumventing this problem. Also changed since the upgrade was the absence of LISTED email addresses for students, so one was forced Blackboard or the MFS pages for emailing students.

After many attempts to "beat" the upgraded flaws in MFS, I was able to find a way to transfer the roster to Excel without the annoying double lines. Here are the instructions for doing so:




- 1. Access the class roster as before
- 2. Click on "Customize"
- 3. Remove check marks in "Frozen"

#### Personalize Column and Sort Order

To order columns or add fields to sort order, highlight column nar Frozen columns display under every tab.



Hide everything but ID and Name by clicking on the other boxes and then on "hidden." The only items that should show in the "Sort Order box are Name and ID:


nn name, then press the appropriate button.



The roster will now only show the student name and ID number in a single row. When the information is transferred or copied to a spread sheet, each name is hot linked to the student's email address. When you click on a name in spreadsheet, your email window automatically be activated with the student's email inserted in the window. You can also re-arrange and/or add to the list of students within Excel.

#### IS YOUR COMPUTER GETTING **SLOW?**

Try emptying your temporary files. Click on the Start button at the bottom left of your screen, then select "Run" from the list. Enter %temp% in the window that opens up and click on OK.

#### CIRCUMVENTING JAPANESE GAMBLING LAWS




They can also choose to receive CHIPS that have various values and those chips can be exchanged for money, but at a different location, usually in a small cubicle in the parking lot.



The winners place the chips into a drawer that slides out of a wall, and an electronic display shows the value of the chips.



The drawer then opens up again with the real money. The person inside the cubicle is not visible from the outside. This indirect method of receiving money for winning at Pachinko, circumvents the legal prohibition against receiving money from gambling.
