Arabic is a member of the South Central Semitic branch of the Semito-Hamitic family. Modern standard literary Arabic is the official language of about 20 countries in and surrounding the Middle East and North Africa. It is spoken in it's various dialects by an estimated 150 million people. The speaker here is a female from Cairo, Egypt.

There are also four "velarized, emphatic" consonants: [‡, ₺, ₺, ₺]. These emphatics as well as the pharyngeal fricatives are much less pronounced in Egyptian Arabic than in other dialects (i.e. see Lebanese Arabic).

Although phonemically, only /i/, /a/, and /u/ are contrastive, allophonically (especially because of the pharyngeal segments) a wide range of variation occurs. Vowel length is contrastive.
