POLICE CADET II

Class Definition

Under supervision, performs assignments restricted to non-enforcement police-related functions.

Distinguishing Characteristics

Police Cadet II is a non-sworn class in the Police Department in which incumbents perform non-enforcement duties such as prisoner transportation, investigation of non-injury traffic collisions, traffic and parking control, booking of prisoners, providing standby guard duty for injured prisoners, and completing related paperwork. Police Cadet II differs from Police Cadet I in that incumbents of the former are expected to demonstrate a higher degree of professionalism and judgement in a variety of situations. Incumbents may be assigned to work variable hours as necessary to include nights, weekends and holidays.

Typical Duties

(May include but are not limited to the following.)

Completes routine police forms for prisoner booking and/or transportation function.

Provides standby guard duty for injured prisoners/arrestees at hospitals and other facilities.

Assists Police Officers with non-enforcement duties; completes routine police reports; appears in court when necessary.

May assist Police Officers in a non-enforcement capacity, direct and control traffic, and provide parking and facility access control.

Directs and controls traffic at accidents.

Performs other duties as assigned.

Knowledge, Skills, Abilities

(The following are a representative sample of the KSA's necessary to perform the duties of the class.)

Knowledge of the geography of the city of Fresno.

Ability to safely operate a motor vehicle.

Ability to follow written and oral instructions and implement proper procedures as required by law and department policy.

Ability to analyze situations and take appropriate action based on training and documented procedures.

Ability to communicate effectively, both orally and in written form and through police radio communications systems.

Ability to stay calm and exercise good judgement in potentially stressful situations.

Ability to respond to work site on short notice.

Ability to establish and maintain effective working relationships.

Minimum Qualifications

Currently attending or successful completion from a California Law Enforcement Basic Academy approved by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training and possession of a high school diploma or equivalent.

Special Requirement(s)

Police Cadet II is designed to prepare the incumbent for a career in law enforcement. Failure to demonstrate the ability to become a Police Officer may result in termination from the program as outlined in F.M.C. Section 2-1652.4.

Pursuant to P.O.S.T. requirements, must be a citizen of the United States or permanent resident alien who is eligible, and has applied, for citizenship before promotion to Cadet II.

Must be at least 18 years of age on or before administration of the first step of the examination process.

Possession of a valid California Driver's License is required.

Bilingual abilities, as may be required to meet community needs.

Must successfully complete a polygraph test, an extensive background investigation, psychological examination and a medical examination prior to appointment.
