Danish is a member of the Scandinavian branch of the Germanic family. It is the official language of the Kindom of Denmark where it is spoken by over 5 million people, and it is a joint official language of the Faeroe Islands and of Greenland. The woman in this recording is in her 30's and speaks the standard, urban, Danish and has an Århus background.
