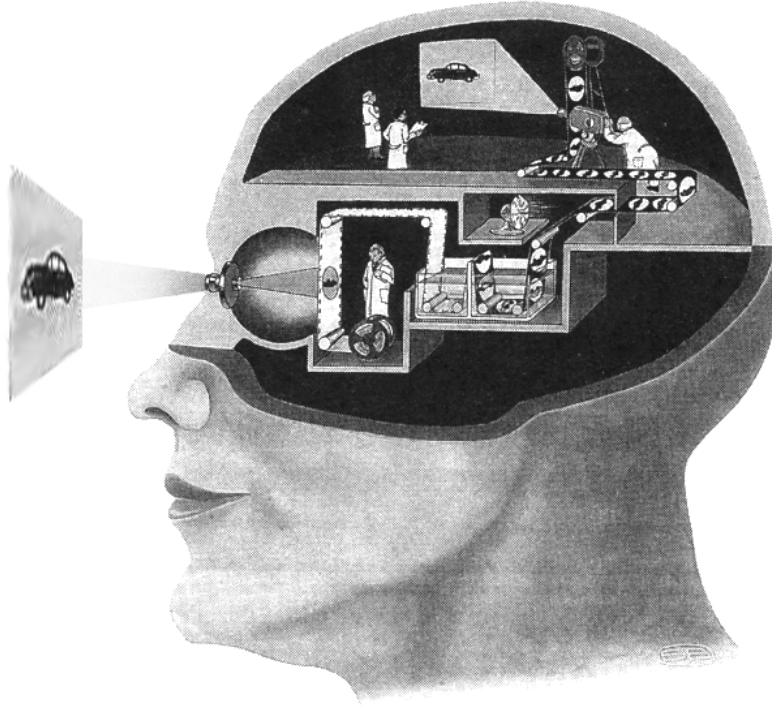


Course Announcement  
CGSCI 100 - Foundations of Cognitive Science  
Dr. Lorin Lachs



What is a brain? What is the mind? What, if anything, does each have to do with the other? Can we get machines to act like brains or minds (or both)? If so, where do we start?

In this course, we'll tackle these questions and others that have perplexed great thinkers throughout history. CGSCI 100 will provide an overview of the field of Cognitive Science, an interdisciplinary area of study focusing on cognition: how we think about and perceive the world, the nature of thought itself, and how we can model the ways in which we think or perceive. Cognitive Science brings together scholars from fields as diverse as computer science, linguistics, neurobiology, philosophy, psychology and robotics. The course will focus on current issues in these fields, and will examine how knowledge in each domain can give a multiply-informed picture of thought and the mind.
